Port Coquitlam Telehandler Training Courses - The employer has the responsibility to make certain that their personnel are trained to work competently with telehandler equipment. The staff must be assessed for their ability to use the machinery. If deficiencies are found, employers must provide training so that employees obtain the needed level of skill. The level of responsibility of the person has to be considered when training is offered. Effective training will remedy any deficiencies in the understanding, knowledge and skills of telehandler operators and supervisors. Training can be undertaken by engaging the services of an external training provider or through in-house sessions. An assessment upon finishing the training period will determine whether or not the learning objectives have been met.

Guidelines and regulations for the basic telehandler operator testing and training are set by state/provincial, local and federal regulators. Basic training does not deal with such subject matters as the lifting of people, the lifting of suspended loads, using different attachments, or the utilization of rotating machinery. Further training will have to be undertaken if such tasks are needed on the work place.

Maintenance and Inspection

The telehandler needs routine maintenance like any other machinery. The machinery would wear out sooner or later, so correct maintenance is needed to guarantee the safe use of the telehandler machine. Checks and inspections are essential to ongoing maintenance procedures. Operators should have machine-specific training in order to prevent, rectify and monitor problems associated with wear, deterioration and damage. Employees need competence and experience in both periodic and breakdown maintenance. The preventive maintenance directions of the manufacturer must be seriously viewed and followed, taking into account such factors as environmental conditions in the work setting and frequency of use.

The user of the machinery along with the owner of the equipment share the responsibility for ensuring that the telehandler is in full working condition. General maintenance is normally performed by the telehandler owner whereas pre-use inspections are typically performed by the user.
