Port Coquitlam Forklift License - Obtaining a forklift license or forklift certification in North America will require the one training to carry out hands-on training in addition to classroom instruction. The state, provincial and federal regulatory bodies are responsible for the training, licensing and certification for powered industrial truck operators. Operators can acquire a license either by a third party or through training administered by the employer. Regardless, regulatory requirements should be met. Recertification is required every two to three years.

The lift truck is a powered industrial machine which is designed with numerous options, like sit-down and stand-up models, electric and propane versions, and various sizes and types to meet the industrial requirements of workers. Operator training courses are often individualized to address the certain uses and kinds for which the operator is training. Training on a sit-down, gas-powered forklift within a warehouse surroundings would not be the same as training on a stand-up, propane-powered forklift in a shipyard. The variety of lift trucks and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all equipment and businesses. Regulatory standards, thus, tend not to concentrate on specific program requirements but instead on the results of individual training programs.

Employer-provided, on-the-job training is the most common method for operators to acquire their forklift license or certification. This particular method of certification requires the employer to provide practical training and classroom sessions on machinery within the workplace. Employers can choose to train personnel on each and every type of forklift separately, or to train them on all machinery combined. The program incorporates forklift operation methods, safety procedures, company regulations and lift truck maintenance. Topics specific to the worksite, such as hazardous materials or conditions, must be covered. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely operate and utilize each type of lift truck on the worksite.

When using a third party trainer, the certification process will typically consist of an on-site component together with hands-on practice.

It must be noted that certifications provided by an employer do not transfer from one employer to the next. Acquiring a forklift license through employer-provided training enables the operator to operate a lift truck for that particular employer only.

The most significant aspect of lift truck license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements differ from one type of machine to another. Safety problems differ from industry to industry and from employer to employer. Both third-party providers and employer-provided training may have to address additional requirements for safety training in applicable industries, like in marine and offshore operations.
